HSP90 plays important roles in folding newly synthesized proteins and stabilizing and refolding denatured proteins after stress. Two forms of HSP90, alpha and beta, are encoded by separate genes.

Applications:	Western Blotting (WB). A concentration of 2.0-4.0 ug/mL is recommended for WB. Human HSP90 (alpha isoform 1) has a predicted length of 732 residues and MW of 85 kDa. Biosensis recommends optimal dilutions/concentrations should be determined by the end user.
Specificity:	The specificity of this antibody has been confirmed by WB against the antigen.
Cross-reactivity:	Human; mouse; rat; rabbit; chicken; frog;
Form:	Lyophilized from 1.2% sodium acetate, 2mg BSA, 0.01mg NaN3
Reconstitution:	Reconstitute in 1 mL of PBS (pH 7.4) to achieve an antibody concentration of 100 ug/mL. Centrifuge to remove any insoluble material.
Storage:	At least 12 months after purchase at 2-8C (lyophilized formulations). After reconstitution, aliquot and store at -20C for a higher stability. Avoid freeze-thaw cycles
Expiry Date:	12 months after purchase

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
